Filipino Chapter

The chapter held its Summer Picnic on July 12, 2014 at Kildonan Park. This event provided opportunity for family members to join in the games for fun and prizes. During the networking portion, chapter members were divided into groups based on the field of practice for a discussion session. Topics include the registration process with Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba and finding engineering-related work in Manitoba. One highlight of the event was the launching of the Bursary Program which would benefit the chapter's student members. The bursary can be used to defray costs associated with the pre-registration process.

The chapter also granted its first "Ako ang Susunod na Pinoy Inhinyero" Bursary Award to two deserving student members – Robin Allan Banaag and Roy San Buenaventura who are both pursuing academic credentials recognition in Civil Engineering.
