The Investigation Committee's mandate is to investigate complaints and concerns received from both the public and members of the Association, as well as to consider questions on professional conduct received from association members. The actions of the Committee are conducted under the authority of Part 9 of The Engineering and Geoscientific Professions Act and are supplemented by the Association's By-Law 15 and the Code of Ethics for the Practice of Professional Engineering & Professional Geoscience.

The Committee held nine meetings between September 1, 2014 and June 30, 2015. In addition, numerous sub-committee meetings were held to review the various complaints, concerns and questions received. The year began with 25 files on record and closed with 20 files on record. A total of 15 new complaints or concerns were received and 20 files were closed.

Of the 15 new files, five were received from members of the public, nine from civic Authorities-having-Jurisdiction, and one from the Continuing Competency Committee dealing with a member who was non-compliant in their Professional Development (ProDev) reporting. It is important to note that some of the complaints received from the public about our members are not of a technical nature, but are related to the real or perceived professional conduct of the member.

On behalf of the Investigation Committee, I would like to thank the Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba support staff, Lorraine Dupas and Mike Gregoire for their dedicated service, and continuing flexibility to attending late day meetings, as is commonly the case with this committee.
