Comments: Provided in the following is a brief summary of India Members Chapter activities during the year from July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016.

- Several informal discussions took place among a few members between June to August 2015 to explore the interest in forming an India Members Chapter of Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba. These discussions led to the formation of a Steering Committee to work on preparing a proposal for an India Members Chapter for Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba approval.
- The Steering Committee consisted of Ganpat Lodha, Ramesh Gupta, Vaibhav Banthia, Jitendra Paliwal, and Nishant Dhruve.
- The committee's first task was to prepare a draft constitution. In a couple of subsequent meetings, the draft constitution was drafted, reviewed, and eventually finalized. In November 2015, the draft constitution was submitted to Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba for review.
- Based on comments received from Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba, the draft was updated and a news notice was sent to invite interested members to the first General Meeting of the proposed India Members Chapter.
- On February 16th 2016, the first General Meeting of the proposed India Chapter was held at Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba office. Mr. Howard Procyshyn, Past President of Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba and Ms. Sharon Shankar, Director of Admissions joined us. In his opening comments Mr. Procyshyn rightly chided us as to what took us so

Where **great minds** meet to form **great ideas**. long to get together and formalize this general meeting. And we rightly wondered why it was so. However, looking around we saw such a gathering of young engineers and geoscientists that we knew we are at the right place at the right time.

In this meeting, the constitution was approved and the eight executives were nominated and elected unopposed. In the first year, four executives were elected for a one year term and four executives were elected for a two year terms setting the stage to elect four executives each year to facilitate continuity of 50 percent of the executive every year. In a subsequent executive meeting, three advisors were elected for terms of one, two, and three years each; again setting the stage for election/nomination of one advisor for a three year term every year. For the first year, two members were requested to join the executive for a one year term as overseers. The complete list of all the executives and advisors and their respective terms is attached as Appendix 1.

- Formal approval of the India Members Chapter by the Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba was received on March 30, 2016 thus creating a landmark and history for India Members.
- In an executive meeting on May 10, 2016 the following sub-committees were formed to facilitate and coordinate:
 - 1. Mentoring New Engineers/Geoscientists Mr. Jitendra Paliwal
 - 2. Finance and Fundraising Mr. Ketan Joshi
 - 3. Public Relations and Outreach- Mr. Vaibhav Banthia
 - 4. Upkeep of the Constitution Mr. Ketan Joshi.

Each sub-committee was requested to invite one of the advisors to join as a member.

- The logo of the India Chapter was designed by the Chapter members and approved by Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba on June 1, 2016.
- On June 21st, 2016, the Chapter's first dinner meeting and technical presentation event was held. Ms. Lesley McFarlane, President of Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba joined us as our Chief Guest and gave a very inspiring speech. In addition to the executive and invited guests almost 40 members joined the event. It was a great evening with pizza dinner, appetizers, and dessert.

 - 2. Dinner and Technical Presentations in November 2016 and February 2017.
 - 3. Celebration Night Dinner in early 2017.
 - 4. Setting up a bank account for our Chapter.

Overview of Dr. Sinha's Presentation:

Dr. Madhav Sinha, P.Eng; since 1966 has pursued a varied career as university professor, quality control manager, research scientist and government administrator. He has received 35 medals, honors and awards for his contributions in the field of quality and innovation
