## 17.6.x Introduction

This proposal makes changes to the process for the approval of by-law changes by allowing the membership to contribute to the discussion of by-law proposals at the annual general meeting or at a special general meeting.

The voting period, which presently runs for at least 15 days, on a date set by the secretary (by-law 17.6.6) occurs before and in conjunction with the next annual general meeting (by-law 17.6.2).

This proposal delays the start of the voting period until 5 business days after the annual or special general meeting. Such a delay is at minimal cost to the association (the scrutineers must hold a second meeting) and provides significant benefits in ensuring that our by-laws are appropriate, effective and workable. The delay allows for the membership to discuss the proposals in the open, face-to-face forum of the meeting while ensuring that attendees at the meeting are aware of comments posted on the online forum and that comments made at the meeting can be posted on the on-line forum.

Note that the current by-laws, section 5.2.3 (h), require that by-law changes appear on the agenda of any annual general meeting. This proposal does not modify that situation but uses that provision for an opportunity for people interested in the association to both contribute and learn.

In consideration of this proposal by council under 17.5.5 of the current by-laws, note that this proposal **only** addresses the timing of the vote on any by-law proposal.
