CARSON HOWARD TEMPLETON

Carson Howard Templeton began his engineering career designing highways and oil pipelines in the Yukon, Northwest Territories and British Columbia. He brought experience gained on the Fraser Valley Dyking Board to his position as Chief Engineer of the Greater Winnipeg Dyking Board in 1950-51, when he directed the planning, design and construction of a system to protect Winnipeg from flooding.

In 1955 he founded Templeton Engineering Company and has been President since that time. He is Vice-President of Teshmont Consultants Ltd., a joint venture which has carried out assignments throughout Canada, the Far East and South America. He organized and is Chairman of the Environment Protection Board, which has as part of its assignment the assessment of the environmental impact of the Mackenzie Valley Gas Pipeline. In 1971, as a project of Templeton Engineering Company, he organized a student placement service.

His interests in, and service to the community have extended far beyond engineering. He has served on the Board of Governors of the University of Manitoba, The University and Community Council of the University of Manitoba, the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Children's Sciences Co-ordinating Council of Greater Winnipeg and was Founder and President of the Northern Environment Foundation.

His respect for the application of a Code of Ethics both in his professional work and in his private life, his courage in espousing the values in which he believes, his integrity and his scrupulous attitude toward professionalism have won him respect and admiration both in the profession and beyond it. His engineering achievements, his keen and dedicated involvement in community affairs, and his unselfish efforts to assist his fellow human beings have brought much credit to him and to the engineering profession of which he is an outstanding member.
