Rudy Isaak became registered with the Association on 12 July 1961, and has been a member continuously for 46 years. Rudy graduated from the University of Manitoba with a B.Sc. degree in Civil Engineering in May 1959.

Rudy was a member of Council for six years and was President in 1981. He served on the Social Committee for three years, the Bulletin/Publication Committee for three years, the Nominating Committee for four years, the Executive/Finance Committee for three years, the Awards Committee for three years, the Consulting Engineers Committee for four years; and the Practice \& Ethics/Investigation Committee for five years. This makes a total of 31 Committee years of service.

Rudy received the Association's Outstanding Service Award in 1993.
Rudy started his career with the University of Manitoba Testing Laboratory in 1960. In 1962 he started working for Templeton Engineering Company and over the next 17 years progressed through the ranks from Senior Design Engineer, Project Engineer Manager, Calgary Office, to Partner. Rudy is also a Fellow of the Canadian Society of Civil Engineers. He was President of the Association of Consulting Engineers of Manitoba in 1993 and President of the University of Manitoba Engineering Alumni Association in 1976.

Over the years Rudy has contributed uncountable hours of volunteer service to the Manitoba Museum of Man and Nature, United Way of Winnipeg, Winnipeg Winter Club, St. Matthew's Church (Winnipeg), and Cathedral Church of the Redeemer (Calgary), University of Manitoba Alumni Association; and the Victoria Beach Community Club.
