Change of owner

- All Health Permits are *not transferrable* between business owners or locations.
- A registration form must be completed and submitted to request a health permit inspection.
- A valid Health Permit is required prior to operating food handling establishments, public and semi-public pools/ whirlpools, and body modification establishments.

For new construction/interior alterations of restaurants, food handling establishments, public/semi-public pools/whirlpools, body modification establishments:

A public health inspector will contact you once the plans are received for review.

Registration and a valid Health Permit is required to operate:

Food Handling Establishments

Includes: restaurants, cafeterias, grocery stores, retail food stores, butcher shop, delicatessen, bakery, food processing, catering, mobile food trucks, food push carts,
Note: Special Events where foods are served or sold such as fairs, festivals, temporary **food service and farmers' markets** must REGISTER. A Health Permit may be required.

Pools

Includes: public and semi-public swimming pools, wading pools and whirlpools

Body Modification Establishments

Includes: tattooing, piercing and microblading.

Special Events:

Special Events where foods are prepared or served must register at least 14 days in advance of the event. The event will be reviewed by a Public Health Inspector to ensure it meets health requirements.

Body Modification Establishments and Personal Service Facilities

Body modifications establishments such as tattooing and microblading require a Health Permit prior to operating in the City of Winnipeg.

Other personal service facilities such as Nail, Beauty and Hair Salons are *encouraged* to register and review tool disinfection practices with their Public Health Inspector.
