DISCIPLINE COMMITTEE

The Discipline Committee is responsible for hearing charges against practitioners made by the Investigation Committee. This committee fulfills one of the core functions of Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba, as mandated by the Act and by-laws. Discipline Committee members determine, as a panel, whether a practitioner is guilty of professional misconduct or unskilled practice, and the appropriate penalties, if required.

General Duties and Responsibilities:

As a Discipline Committee member, you will work as a panel of three to review charges of professional misconduct or unskilled practice. With the assistance of legal counsel, the panel hears arguments from the Investigation Committee and the investigated person, reviews witness testimony, and considers legal precedence, then makes a written decision as to whether the investigated person is guilty. If the member is found guilty, the panel will then make decision on appropriate penalties.

Specific Skills and Qualifications

- A professional member licensed with EngGeoMB (P.Eng. or P.Geo.)
- 10+ years of professional practice is required
- Knowledge of the Act and by-laws
- Some knowledge of the judicial process
- Previous experience on EngGeoMB committees is preferred

Time Commitment:

The workload for Discipline Committee members depends on the volume of charges made against investigated persons. Participation in a hearing will be infrequent, however, when a hearing is required, multiple full days may be required to hear the matter.
