Manitoba Climate Resilience Training Working Group

Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba was successful in receiving funding from the Manitoba Government for climate change training in the 2022-2023 Provincial Government fiscal year. In addition to updating BRACE/MCRT 1.0 training courses in adaptation and delivering them to new audiences, the group plans to develop and deliver new courses that address mitigation, and to identify a comprehensive list of new and existing training resources that would be of the most benefit for our target group of engineers, geoscientists, and other stakeholders.

General Duties and Responsibilities:

- Provide advice on the training needs of engineers, geoscientists, other professionals, and decision-makers in climate change adaptation and mitigation.
- Give advice for course content, development, delivery, and assessment to support in readying the professions to address climate change in their professional practice.
- Provide input on training methods, timing, and content on training pilots and actual course delivery, including lessons learned.

Specific Skills and Qualifications:

- Looking for volunteers from a variety of sectors, such as biosystems, geoscience, buildings, and transportation; experience in greenhouse gas reduction activities, methods, or technologies would be an asset.
- A keen interest in climate change adaptation and mitigation

Time Commitment:

Working Group members would be required to attend one to four meetings a month (including reviewing piloted courses) from November 2022 to April 2023. Meetings will primarily be held virtually, although the group anticipates offering in-person courses in February and March of 2023.
